Colonel Michael A. Madrid is the Chief of Aerospace Medicine for the 355th Medical Group, Davis-Monthan Air Force Base, Arizona. He is responsible for providing medical support for more than 7,500 Airmen through numerous programs he manages. He is responsible for organizing and training nine Flight Surgeons and Airmen from other divisions. The 355<sup>th</sup> Medical Group provides direct medical support and advice to the 355th Fighter Wing.

Colonel Madrid earned his Naval Commission in 1988 from the U.S. Navy Aviation Officer Candidate School, NAS Pensacola, Florida. He transitioned to the inactive ready reserve in 1994 and accepted an Air Force commission in 1999 attending Uniformed Services University of Health Sciences receiving his Medical Degree in 2003. Prior to his current assignment, Colonel Madrid served as the Chief of Medical Standards for Air Education and Training Command, Randolph AFB, Texas.



Colonel Madrid while serving as a Naval Helicopter Aircraft Commander had over 1100 hours in the T-34, TH-57, and SH-60B. He flew in support of Operation PROVIDE COMFORT. Colonel Madrid continues to fly as a Senior Flight Surgeon with over 500 hours in F-16, T-6, T-38, T-1, T-43, UH-60, UH-1, H-65, MH-60, C-5, C-21, C-12, C-130, KC-135
