## HOW THE POLL WAS CONDUCTED

This poll was commissioned by First Liberty Institute. It was conducted by MasonDixon Polling \& Strategy, Inc. of Jacksonville, Florida from May 13 through May 18, 2022. A total of $\mathbf{1 , 1 0 0}$ registered voters were interviewed nationwide by telephone.

Those interviewed were randomly selected from a nationwide voter registration list that included both landlines and mobile phones. Quotas were assigned in order to reflect voter registration by state.

The margin for error, according to standards customarily used by statisticians, is no more than $\pm 3$ percentage points. This means that there is a 95 percent probability that the "true" figure would fall within that range if all voters were surveyed. The margin for error is higher for any subgroup, such as a gender or age grouping.

QUESTION: Do you support or oppose ending the filibuster in the United States Senate?

QUESTION: The filibuster requires that 60 Senators must vote for a bill before it can come to the floor of the Senate for a final vote. It is designed as a check on the power of the U.S. House of Representatives, which can move legislation through very quickly with simple majority votes. The filibuster is designed to slow the process so that there is more debate and that final approval of a law has some level of bi-partisan support. Based on this information, do you support or oppose ending the filibuster in the Senate?
