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### HOW THE POLL WAS CONDUCTED

**This poll was commissioned by First Liberty Institute. It was conducted by Mason-Dixon Polling & Strategy, Inc. of Jacksonville, Florida from May 13 through May 18, 2022. A total of 1,100 registered voters were interviewed nationwide by telephone.**

**Those interviewed were randomly selected from a nationwide voter registration list that included both landlines and mobile phones. Quotas were assigned in order to reflect voter registration by state.**

**The margin for error, according to standards customarily used by statisticians, is no more than  $\pm 3$  percentage points. This means that there is a 95 percent probability that the "true" figure would fall within that range if all voters were surveyed. The margin for error is higher for any subgroup, such as a gender or age grouping.**
