



PRESIDENTIAL RECORD COMPARISON FOR THE 2024 ELECTION

This document compares actions taken by the Trump and Biden administrations on issues that matter to faith voters.



ORIGINALIST JUDGES

Appointed originalist judges to the U.S. Supreme Court (**Gorsuch**, **Kavanaugh**, and **Barrett**) and to lower courts; opposed court-packing.¹

Appointed progressive judges to the U.S. Supreme Court (**Jackson**) and to lower courts; explored court-packing.²

RELIGIOUS FREEDOM

Supported religious freedom in key **U.S. Supreme Court cases**; **issued rules** protecting religious freedom for religious organizations, students, and healthcare professionals; created a **Religious Liberty Taskforce** at the DOJ; advocated for the **repeal of the Johnson Amendment.**³

Opposed religious freedom in most **U.S. Supreme Court cases**; reversed Trump-era rules protecting religious freedom for religious organizations and healthcare professionals; celebrated Transgender Day of Visibility on Easter Sunday.⁴

FREE SPEECH

Issued an **executive order** to promote and protect free speech; supported free speech in key **U.S. Supreme Court cases.**⁵

Created a **Disinformation Governance Board**; had the **FBI investigate parents/Catholics**; opposed free speech in key **U.S. Supreme Court cases.**⁶

RELIGIOUS FAMILIES

Supported traditional marriage; protected faith-based adoption & foster care providers; supported religious school choice.⁷

Supported same-sex marriage; removed Trump-era protections for faith-based adoption & foster care providers; issued rules that can ban people of faith as foster parents; opposed religious school choice.⁸

LIFE

Supported **overturning** *Roe v. Wade*; supported **banning late-term abortions**; provided religious and moral **exemptions from the contraceptive mandate**; **restricted taxpayer funding for abortion**; allowed pro-life pregnancy centers to receive federal funds; was the first American President to **speak at the March for Life.**⁹

Supported codifying *Roe v. Wade*; supported upholding late-term abortions; sought to reverse Trump-era exemptions from the contraceptive mandate; reinstated taxpayer funding for abortion; restricted pro-life pregnancy centers from receiving federal funds; made abortion pills available by mail.¹⁰

LGBT ISSUES

Supported the **traditional definition of "sex"**; **opposed the Equality Act**; supported keeping **men out of women's sports**;
protected privacy and safety for female students; banned
U.S. embassies from flying LGBT flags.¹¹

Redefined "sex" to include sexual orientation and gender identity; supported the Equality Act; supported men in women's sports; supported the gender transition of children; authorized U.S. embassies flying LGBT flags; lit the White House in rainbow colors.¹²

MILITARY

Strengthened military religious liberty; permitted religious symbols at military facilities; disallowed service by military personnel with gender dysphoria.¹³

Issued a military COVID-19 vaccine mandate without any religious exemptions; required VA health facilities to provide abortion services; allowed service by military personnel with gender dysphoria.¹⁴

ISRAEL

Recognized **Jerusalem as Israel's capital**; moved the **U.S. Embassy to Jerusalem**; fought attacks on Israel at the UN; negotiated **the Abraham Accords**; ended all aid to Palestine; withdrew from the Iran deal.¹⁵

Gave half a billion dollars in aid to Palestine; pledged to stand by Israel after the October 7 Hamas attack; placed unprecedented conditions on military aid to Israel; called for Israel to end the war; released \$10 billion in funds to Iran. 16
